About NOIA

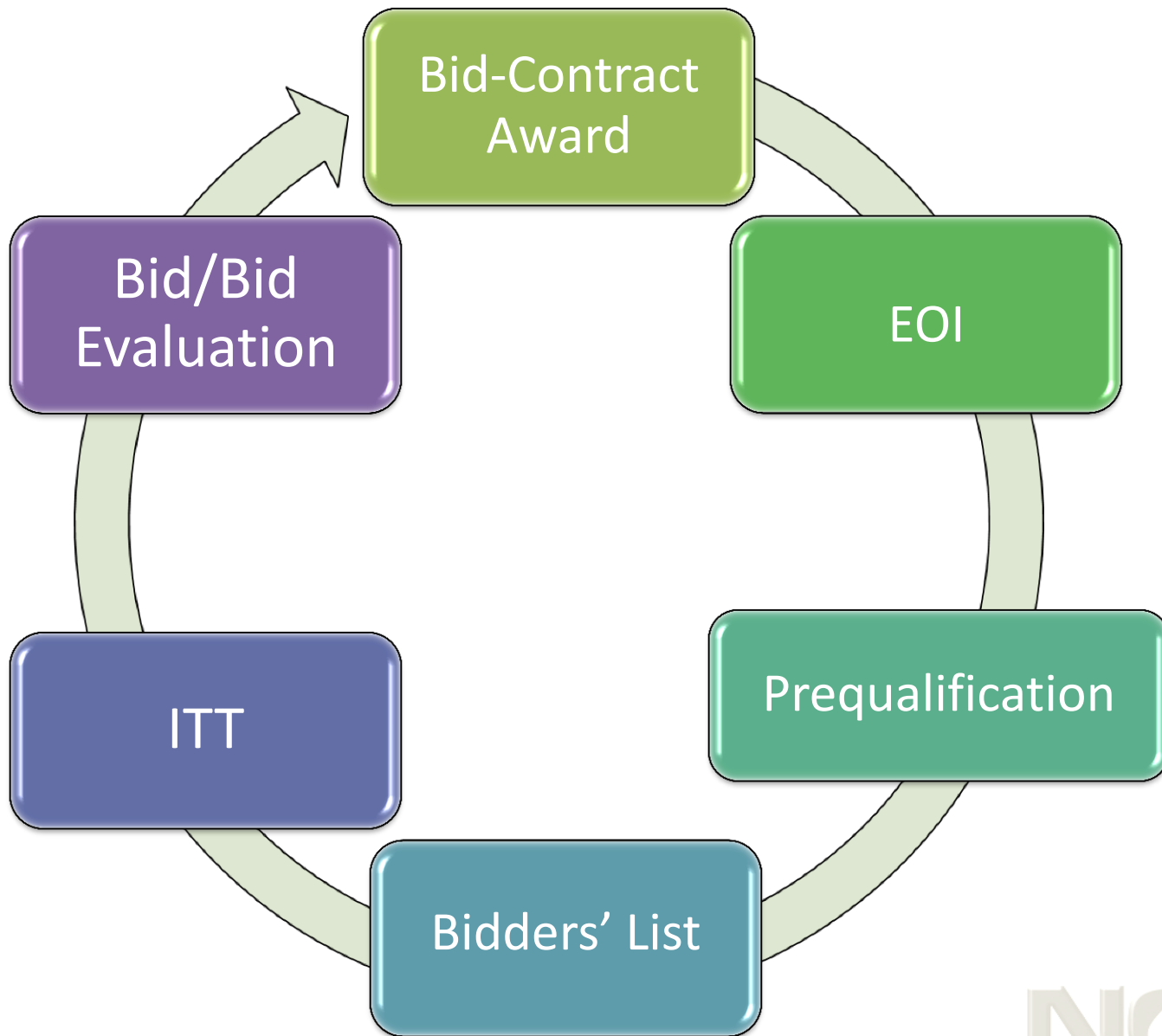
- Founded in 1977, NOIA represents the supply & service sector in the province's oil and gas industry

Modules

- NOIA believes it's the responsibility of the proponent to find a way to build all three modules in Newfoundland & Labrador:
 - living quarters
 - drilling support
 - drilling equipment module
- On Nov. 23, 2011, The proponent announced it believes that Kiewit yard in Marystown has the capacity and capability to build the drilling support module but not the drilling equipment module

Utilities Process Module

Internationally built equipment and modules **should** provide as a **minimum** contracting opportunities for the local supply & service community to carry out maintenance work during the operations phase of the Hebron project

Early, detailed and regular information through
supplier information sessions

NOIA Recommendations

1. Scale the size of bid packages to meet local capabilities
2. Develop a consistent, transparent procurement process with a strong local benefits approach
3. Exceed local benefits benchmarks
4. Submit a separate Benefits Plan for the Pool 3
5. Carry out supplier development sessions for NL companies on the UPM
6. Provide specific percentages of employment and expenditure levels expected to occur in NL at each stage of the project
7. Create a mechanism to publicly track, measure, compare and regularly report the detailed local content achievements
